Thrilling hot air balloon flights over the vast Namib Sand Sea and mystical fairy circles are launched from our private reserve. Adventures exclusive to Wilderness guests within the private reserve include guided nature drives, electric powered fat-wheeled bike excursions, nature and running trails by day. By night, walks reveal fascinating nocturnal activity, while the spectacular night skies offer the best in star gazing.

Park opening hours are from sunrise to sunset, with the best time on the dunes being sunrise when the sand is cool and easier to walk through, with views being particularly spectacular – suggestion to have breakfast on-the-go and enjoy the golden hour on the dune (personalised safari breakfast packed by chefs). During summer, the Sesriem Gate opens around 05:30 and closes around 18:30, while the inner gate opens around 05:00 and closes around 19:30. With this change in ground operations, from the previous 23 to the current 21, and aligning with the Discovery offering, the option of private activities is no longer available (i.e. the initial exception made to the standard Discovery category ruling, where private activities were on offer, when booking on the FI rate basis only, is no longer possible). As an exception in the Kulala Wilderness Reserve, booking of a private vehicle was previously possible from Wilderness Kulala Desert Lodge to be used for guests staying at Wilderness Little Kuala. However, as of 16 July 2024 to 31 December 2026 (inclusive), this is no longer possible. Note that guests at Wilderness Kulala Desert Lodge cannot book the private vehicle from Wilderness Little Kulala (current ruling ongoing and applicable beyond 31 December 2026, and upon inventory being shown in the booking system).
